ORDER ON BANKRUPTCY STATUS OF CAREY CANADA CORPORATION

It appearing that on October 12, 1990, CAREY CANADA CORPORATION, a defendant in numerous asbestos-related cases in this district, filed a petition pursuant to Chapter 11 of Title 11, United States Code, in the United States Bankruptcy Court for the Middle District of Florida, Tampa Division, thereby effecting the automatic stay provision of 11 U.S.C. Section 362, and,

It also appearing that the U. S. District Court in the Eastern District of Texas has previously directed that all claims against other asbestos defendants found to be seeking relief under Chapter 11 bankruptcy have been ordered severed for the purpose of administrative closing and assignment to the inactive docket of the Court and,

It further appearing that severing and administratively closing all claims relating to CAREY CANADA CORPORATION would also benefit the Court in respect to its statistical reporting and case management procedures;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that, pursuant to Rule 21, Federal Rules of Civil Procedure, all claims, counterclaims, cross claims and third-party claims brought by or against CAREY CANADA CORPORATION

in all pending asbestos civil actions in this court are hereby SEVERED from the main actions; and


IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that such severed claims shall be and are hereby ADMINISTRATIVELY CLOSED and assigned to the inactive docket of this court.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that all claims against CAREY CANADA CORPORATION shall be restored to the active docket of the court when the automatic stay provisions have been vacated pursuant to the provisions of 11 U.S.C. Section 362(c)(2)(A)(B)(C).

IT IS ORDERED that the same procedures shall be followed concerning any future CAREY CANADA CORPORATION claims severed from asbestos cases.
