

This order amends General Order Number 88-27, Amended Order Assigning Civil and Criminal Actions, dated August 29, 1988. Changes effected by this amendment include the reassignment of all Texarkana Division cases from the docket of Judge Paul Brown to the docket of Judge Sam B. Hall, Jr.; the random reassignment of

Judge Hall's former portion of the Beaumont Division asbestos cases to Judges Cobb, Schell, Fisher, Parker, Justice and Steger, at 16.66% respectively; and the random reassignment of Judge Hall's former portion of all other Beaumont Division civil cases to Judges Cobb, Schell and Fisher, at 33.33%, respectively.

It is further ORDERED that any cases re-opened on or after June 1, 1990, shall be re-opened to the docket of the judge to whom the case was assigned at time of closing.
