87-6: GENERAL ORDER ASSIGNING CASES TO UNITED STATES MAGISTRATES

Acting by consent of the judges of this court, it is ORDERED, effectively immediately, that all civil rights complaints, petitions for writs of habeas corpus and other matters received from persons in custody, together with civil and criminal actions wherein the parties have consented for trial before a United States Magistrate, and all other matters in cases designated for handling by full-time magistrates by the Local Rules for the Assignment of Duties to United States Magistrates shall be referred and assigned to Magistrates Harry W. McKee, Earl S. Hines, Judith K. Guthrie and J. Michael Bradford in the percentages set forth hereafter:


Assignment of additional duties will be made as deemed appropriate by the judges of this court.

In divisions served by more than one full-time United States Magistrate, cases referred to the magistrate after the date of

this order shall be assigned randomly by lot in accordance with the percentages listed above.

Transfers between the magistrates of this district for the purpose of equalizing the magistrates' pending civil and criminal dockets in the various divisions will be entered as necessary.
