


GENERAL ORDER NO. 97-16

ORDER ADOPTING NEW FORMS FOR PRISONERS
FILING ACTIONS UNDER 42 U.S.C. §1983

It is hereby ORDERED, effective immediately, that this court adopt a prescribed form for prisoners filing complaints under the Civil Rights Act, 42 U.S.C. §1983. The prescribed form is attached hereto as Exhibit A. Complaints may be accepted and filed in other forms at the discretion of the court; however, completion of the prescribed form may be required as an auxiliary pleading.

It is further ORDERED, effective immediately, that this court adopt a prescribed form for prisoners seeking to proceed *in forma pauperis* under 28 U.S.C. §1915. The prescribed form is attached hereto as Exhibit B.

It is finally ORDERED, that General Order 96-11 is rescinded.

Re: Your Request for Forms for Filing a Civil Rights Complaint

The forms you requested are enclosed. Please read the forms and follow the instructions very carefully. Make certain you have answered all the questions and have signed in all the required places.

The filing fee for this type of civil action is \$350. If you pay the \$350 now, you must submit your check or money order made payable to: Clerk, U. S. District Court, together with your complaint. All inmates must pay the \$350 filing fee, although the Court will permit you to pay the fee according to a payment plan established by the Court.

If you are unable to pay the filing fee and service costs for this complaint, you may request the Court to allow you to proceed *in forma pauperis* [IFP] (application is enclosed). If you use this form, you must answer each and every question and sign the form. If you are an inmate, you must obtain a certified print out of your trust fund account from the facility in which you are incarcerated. Texas prison inmates must submit a certified *in forma pauperis* data sheet, which may be obtained from the law library on your unit. **DO NOT SEND the COMPLAINT WITHOUT the completed and CERTIFIED IFP DATA SHEET** Otherwise, your case cannot be processed and will be delayed.

Please give special attention to the following information:

PARTIES: The parties to a law suit are the plaintiff (the person who is filing the suit) and the defendant (the person who is being sued). List the full names of each defendant on page 1. If you cannot obtain the full names, supply an initial or state the name is unknown. On page 2, list the defendant again with a full address. If there is more than one defendant, the defendants should be listed in the same order as on page 1.

If there is more than one plaintiff, each plaintiff must be listed on page 1 and must sign the complaint on the last page. Each plaintiff must also submit a separate and completed IFP form.

STATEMENT OF CLAIM: It is very important you state a claim against each named defendant. Give only the facts without legal arguments or case law. Do not submit exhibits or evidence with your complaint. Save those items for any hearing that may be set.

FILING: Submit only the original complaint to the Court. Keep a copy for your records. Once the original is filed, it cannot be returned unless ordered by the Court. Use a typewriter or black ink. Your complaint must be legible. Do not use legal size paper. Use standard size paper (8 ½ x 11 inches). Do not write on the reverse side of any page. Leave space (margins) at each side and on the top and bottom of the page.

It is your responsibility to keep the Court informed of your current address. If you are transferred or released, you must file a "Notice of Change of Address" with the Clerk. You must also certify that you have sent the notice to the defendant's attorney (if any). Failure to follow this rule may result in your case being dismissed.

VENUE: Your complaint can be brought in this Judicial District if at least one of the defendants reside in this district or the cause of action arose in this district. If not, you are in the wrong court. Submitting your complaint to the wrong court will only delay the proceedings.

INSTRUCTIONS - READ CAREFULLY

NOTICE:

Your complaint is subject to dismissal unless it conforms to these instructions and this form.

1. To start an action you must file an original and one copy of your complaint with the court. You should keep a copy of the complaint for your own records.
2. Your complaint must be legibly handwritten, in ink, or typewritten. You, the plaintiff, must sign and declare under penalty of perjury that the facts are correct. If you need additional space, **DO NOT USE THE REVERSE SIDE OR BACK SIDE OF ANY PAGE.** ATTACH AN ADDITIONAL BLANK PAGE AND WRITE ON IT.
3. You must file a separate complaint for each claim you have unless the various claims are all related to the same incident or issue or are all against the same defendant, Rule 18, Federal Rules of Civil Procedure. Make a short and plain statement of your claim, Rule 8, Federal Rules of Civil Procedure.
4. When these forms are completed, mail the original and one copy to the Clerk of the United States Court for the appropriate District of Texas in the Division where one or more named defendants are located, or where the incident giving rise to your claim for relief occurred. The list labeled as "VENUE LIST" is posted in your unit law library. It is a list of the Texas prison units indicating the appropriate District Court, the Division and an address list of the Divisional Clerks.

FILING FEE AND IN FORMA PAUPERIS

1. In order for your complaint to be filed, it must be accompanied by the filing fee of \$350.00.
2. If you do not have the necessary funds to pay the filing fee in full at this time, you may request permission to proceed *in forma pauperis*. In this event you must complete the application to proceed *in forma pauperis (IFP)*, setting forth information to establish your inability to prepay the fees and costs or give security therefor. You must also include a current six (6) month history of your Inmate Trust Account. You can acquire the application to proceed IFP and appropriate Inmate Account Certificate from the law library at your prison unit.
3. 28 U.S.C. 1915, as amended by the Prison Litigation Reform Act of 1995 (PLRA), provides, "...if a prisoner brings a civil action or files an appeal *in forma pauperis*, the prisoner shall be required to pay the full amount of a filing fee." Thus, the Court is required to assess and, when funds exist, collect, the entire filing fee or an initial partial filing fee and monthly installments until the entire amount of the filing fee has been paid by the prisoner. If you submit the application to proceed *in forma pauperis*, the Court will apply 28 U.S.C. 1915 and, if appropriate, assess and collect the entire filing fee or an initial partial filing fee, then monthly installments from your Inmate Account, until the entire \$350 filing fee has been paid.
4. If you intend to seek *in forma pauperis* status, then do not send your complaint without an Application to Proceed IFP, and the Certificate of Inmate Trust Account. Complete all the essential paperwork before submitting it to the Court.
5. **The complaint can not exceed 20 pages which includes all attachments.**

CHANGE OF ADDRESS

It is your responsibility to inform the Court of any change of address and its effective date. Such notice should be marked "**NOTICE TO THE COURT OF CHANGE OF ADDRESS**" and shall not include any motion (s) for any other relief. Failure to file a NOTICE TO THE COURT OF CHANGE OF ADDRESS may result in the dismissal of your complaint pursuant to Rule 41(b), Federal Rules of Civil Procedure.

5. I understand even if I am allowed to proceed without prepayment of costs, I am responsible for the entire \$350 filing fee and costs assessed by the Court, which shall be deducted in accordance with the law from my inmate account by my custodian until the filing fee is paid.
