GENERAL ORDER APPOINTING MAGISTRATE JUDGE MERIT SELECTION PANEL

The current term of office for United States Magistrate Judge John D. Love is due to expire on January 1, 2022. The judges of this Court have voted to consider reappointing Judge Love. The Panel shall review the incumbent judge’s current service as magistrate judge, the comments from members of the bar and public, and other evidence of the incumbent’s good character, legal ability, temperament, and commitment to equal justice under the law. The Panel shall report to the Court within ninety (90) calendar days of the date of this order as to whether the incumbent is recommended for reappointment.

Additionally, the Clerk of Court is directed to cause to be published public notices regarding the reappointment of Magistrate Judge John D. Love. The notices shall be published in conformance with the procedures specified in Chapter 13 of The Selection, Appointment and Reappointment of United States Magistrate Judges (Administrative Office of the U.S. Courts, October 2016).

Effective on September 13, 2016, the Judicial Conference of the United States adopted amendments to the regulations governing the selection, appointment, and reappointment of magistrate judges. One of the amendments creates an obligation on the part of the court to notify merit selection panel members in writing of the restriction in § 420.30.20(d) as it applies to them, which essentially restricts panel members from applying for any magistrate judge position within this district until one year has elapsed since the panel member has served on the Panel. This provision is located in the regulations at § 420.30.10(c). The Clerk of Court is directed to immediately cause all panel members to be advised in writing of the restrictions set forth in § 420.30.20(d).
